- Market Analysis Overview Todd Poole Presentation
- Key takeaways for CPC:
 - CPC members questioned some of the accuracy of the date in Todd's reporting, saying some data and maps were outdated and don't reflect what's happening in Lancaster in Dec. 2021.
 - Some CPC members challenged Todd Poole's assertion during his presentation that Gentrification, in some cases, can be a positive thing. Some CPC members responded that gentrification is not a positive thing for the people who are affected by it. Some CPC members insisted the term gentrification not be characterized as a positive thing in the Marketing report
 - Regarding affording housing, some members questioned the assertion in Todd Poole's report that affordable housing will be more plentiful in the future. CPC members said, to the contrary, affording housing is not plentiful, particularly when you add the fact that much of the housing stock in Lancaster contains lead and that it costs money for remedication.



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• City of Lancaster Team said it would review the data and assertions in Todd's report and make corrections and adjustments where needed before presenting that data back to the committee.
